When the going gets this tough, we all yearn for something soothing and satisfying to make us feel on top of the world again. A sweet deal on a meal is the best of both worlds, enabling us to rationalize the pleasure without abandoning it.

In Wine Country, it’s easy to indulge champagne tastes on a beer budget if you shop around, look for decadence in small doses and

are willing to go out on a Wednesday, say, instead of a weekend night.

Here’s how to scale back your tab without forgoing the sublime pleasure of an indulged tummy.

**TUESDAY SPECIAL:** At **Nick’s Cove** in Marshall, overlooking Tomales Bay, you’re swept back in time by the nostalgic 1930s decor. But the modern-day prices can be a shock.

That’s why locals from Point Reyes to Petaluma show up on Tuesday nights, when the upscale restaurant offers an affordable special made from local ingredients, plus cheap draft beers (\$3) and free music. On a recent Tuesday, the entree consisted of a full pound of sweet and spicy Petaluma chicken wings with blue cheese dressing for just \$10.
